Thursday January the 12th 1897
this day pleasant weather and light winds from
the N N E steard E saw some porpoises
So ends this day Satt 2600 Long 149190 448

Friday January the 13th 1897
this day pleasant weather and light winds
from the N N E saw some porpoises and shortened sail
So ends this day Satt 2600 Long 149100 449

Saturday January the 14th 1897
this day pleasant weather and variable winds
steard to the E under all sail
So ends this day Satt 2700 Long 14240 450

Sunday January the 15th 1897
this day strong winds from the E and squalls
of rain steard to the N and porpoises
So ends this day Satt 2700 Long 142100 451

Monday January the 16th 1897
this day strong winds and squally steard
to the N under short sail
So ends this day Satt 2600 Long 142190 452

Tuesday January the 17th 1897
this day strong winds from the E steard to the
N N under short sail saw nothing worth notes
So ends this day Satt 2600 Long 142095 453

Wednesday January the 18th 1897
this day strong winds from the E S E and squally
steard to the N N E saw some porpoises
and a boat the waist boat got it whaled
at 10 AM took him it long side at 4 PM
commenced cutting the Meridian by got through
cutting So ends this day Satt 2400 Long 142000 454

Thursday January the 19th 1897
this day strong gale from the E S E
steard to the S under short sail
the water in the hold boiling
So ends this day Satt 2400 Long 142110 455

Friday January the 20th 1897
this day first part strong winds and squalls
latter strong gales and some rain and
from the E N E it got through boiling
So ends this day Satt 2400 Long 142195 456

Saturday January the 21th 1897
this day strong gale from the N E steard
with torrents of rain shortened sail a cabin
required it 4 PM took in the main top sail
So ends this day Satt 2400 Long 142150 457

Sunday January the 22th 1897
this day first part commences with a strong
gale from the N E and squally latter part
more moderate it tender with rain at 9 PM
set the main top sail at 10 PM set the fore sail
at 11 PM set the fore top sail and squalls
steard to the SE saw nothing worth notes
