under full sail the watch in place  
at Mending sails saw nothing  
So ends this day Lat 11.47 Long 148.40

Saturday February the 15th 1894  
this day pleasant weather and strong winds from  
the S.E. steard to the S under full sail  
of sail at 8 AM saw plenty of  
black fish saw 3 boats and got 9  
black fish 1 to each boat  
So ends this day Lat 10.19 Long 148.40  
515

Sunday February the 16th 1894  
this day pleasant weather and strong winds from  
the S.E. steard to the S under full  
sail saw 3 sampers  
So ends this day Lat 9.20 Long 148.40  
516

Monday February the 20th 1894  
this day pleasant weather and light winds  
from the S.E. saw 3 sampers steard  
to the S the watch in place at Mending  
sails So ends this day Lat 9.20 Long 148.40  
517

Tuesday February the 21st 1894  
this day strong winds from the S.E. steard  
to the S.E. shortened sail at 10 AM  
So ends this day Lat 8.21 Long 148.40  
518

Wednesday February the 22nd 1894  
this day squally weather steard to the  
S.E. by the wind under short sail  
So ends this day Lat 7.21 Long 148.40  
519

Thursday February the 23rd 1894  
this day squally from the E to 10 AM  
saw Sundry island having N.E. Dist. 6 leagues  
saw 1 ship in shore  
So ends this day Lat 6.21 Long 148.40  
520

Friday February the 24th 1894  
this day pleasant weather at 4 PM  
spoke the ship stationer Canon at 1200  
of oil at 6 PM spoke the William Hamilton  
6 Swain of men beyond 9 PM 9800 lbs of  
oil at 4 PM sent the 2 lots of shore  
iron wood could not obtain camp on the shore  
account of breakers on the shore returned  
to the ship at Menean  
So ends this day Lat 5.21 Long 148.40

Saturday February the 25th 1894  
this day light winds from the S.E. strong  
barn steard to the S.E. steard to the  
N.E. in company with a Hamilton  
So ends this day Lat 4.22 Long 148.40

Sunday February the 26th 1894  
this day light winds from the S.E. steard  
to the N.E. in company with  
Captain Swain at 9 PM the land bore at 154  
So ends this day Lat 3.23 Long 148.40  
523

Monday February the 27th 1894  
this day light winds from the S.E. steard  
to the N.E. with Captain Swain  
So ends this day Lat 2.24 Long 148.40  
524

Tuesday February the 28th 1894  
this day light winds from the S.E. steard  
to the N.E. in company with 6 Swain  
saw nothing worth notice  
So ends this day Lat 1.25 Long 148.40
