at 1st I spoke the ship Enchirion taken
38 Nov 1886 while I sail at the ship
Lancaster Swift she was loaded 28 March
out 1888 hull of oil at 14 if more of oil
she and I 1st this day ends with pleasant
weather saw nothing
So ends this day Lat 21.50 Long 148.54 540

Thursday March the 16th 1894
this day light calm weather at 1st I saw
a large school of whales, heard 3 boats
and boat returned at 6 p.m. to the ship
with nothing and lay under short sail
threw the night and this day ends with
calm Lat 24.40 Long 149.10 541

Friday March the 17th 1894
this day calm with sun rain saw nothing
worth mention the watch in flood at waves 100
So ends this day Lat 27.00 Long 149.19 542

Saturday March the 18th 1894
this day squally weather steered to the
S. and S. and S. and S. and S. and S. and S.
saw some grampses. So
So ends this day Lat 28.10 Long 150.00 543

Sunday March the 19th 1894
this day burst part strong wind and
and later part moderate breeze from
the S. & steered to the S. & under all
saw nothing worth mention
So ends this day Lat 29.10 Long 149.00 544

Monday March the 20th 1894
this day light wind and waves
steered to the S. & saw black fish
So ends this day Lat 30.10 Long 148.00 545

Tuesday March the 21st 1894
this day light wind and waves from the
S. to the S. steered by the wind to the
S. & under all saw black fish
the watch in flood at waves 100
So ends this day Lat 31.00 Long 147.10 546

Wednesday March the 22nd 1894
this day light wind and calm saw nothing
worth notice the watch in flood at waves 100
So ends this day Lat 31.10 Long 147.10 547

Thursday March the 23rd 1894
this day light wind and calm thick overcast
weather saw porpoises and billard the watch
in flood at waves 100
So ends this day Lat 31.10 Long 146.10 548

Friday March the 24th 1894
this day light wind and waves from the N.
steered to the S. under all saw nothing
worth notice the watch in flood at waves 100
So ends this day Lat 32.10 Long 146.10 549

Saturday March the 25th 1894
this day strong wind from the S. steered to the
S. & the watch in flood at waves 100
saw nothing
So ends this day Lat 34.10 Long 145.10 550

Sunday March the 26th 1894
this day commences with a strong breeze
from the S. and with it heavy rain the
island of St. Michael being about 90
miles off we were bound to carry sail
to get off the sea and to high the
it swept our boats from the ship we was
forced to lay to and saw our way and
ended
