Tuesday April the 15th 1894
this day present weather the crew in place
at ship duty & men sick
so ends this day 580

Wednesday April the 16th 1894
this day present weather the watch in place
at named place the other watch in place at
at shore on liberty
so ends this day 581

Thursday April the 17th 1894
this day strong winds the watch in place
at duty the other watch at shore
so ends this day 582

Friday April the 18th 1894
this day strong winds and warcel
we are in place at warcel place
getting ready for sea
so ends this day 583

Saturday April the 19th 1894
this day strong winds from the S.W.
the ship company in place at getting ready
for all this
so ends day 584

Sunday April the 20th 1894
this day present weather the watch at
shore on liberty so ends day 585

Monday April the 21st 1894
this day present weather & men converted
1 man fell down in the hole and broke his shoulder
586

and it got and put him to shore on the
rockets and converted body & body
canpinner or blow ship when in their place
so ends this day 587

Tuesday April the 22nd 1894
this day present weather at 4.00 AM took our
Anker and fed down to water with light
minds from the S
so ends this day 588

Wednesday April the 23rd 1894
and dropped our Anker at 10 took our and store
down the bay at 4.00 AM the wind hauled
at 10 or to the E and very light we
was forced to put in and Ankered in
4 fathoms of water at water 589
so ends this day

Thursday April the 24th 1894
this day present weather at the stuan I on the
Account of his Phusen tang and shipped at
Nathan and 1 man
so ends this day 590

Friday April the 25th 1894
this day commences with present weather and
light winds from the E & S took our Anker
and put to sea in company with the Caroline
of Sydney and the James Thomson stole the
west coast of west coast of New Guinea
out with 2300 blks of oil bound in and
a rather ship bound in at 4.00 AM the Chai
Jounn Man and the Mast heads and nothing
except two ships the Caroline and James
Thomson now the wind continues blowing
at gentle breeze from the E & S and by
the wind to the S.W.
so ends this day the land is still
40 AM 591
