

Saturday April the 29th 1834
this day strong wind from the E with a
high sea steered to the N.E. by the wind
the watch imployed till duty requiring
the boats
So ends this day South Long 492

Sunday April the 30th 1834
this day a strong gale from the S shortened sail &
a cabin required led to the S.E.
So ends this day 493

Monday May the 1st 1834
this day a strong gale from the S led to
the S.E. under short sail here sail and hail
top sail stay sails & sea on and cloudy
So ends this day 494

Tuesday May the 2nd 1834
this day the gale & haled till 1 P.M. made sail
and move ship to the S.W. till 9 P.M. tacked to
the S.E. the watch imployed till ware? John?
So ends this day 495

Wednesday May the 3rd 1834
this day a strong hake and heavy sea from
the S.W. steered to the S.E. finding the
ship still under full sail on the ship
when the ^{wind} blew & lost reef top
sail here 2 men & left
So ends this day 496

Thursday May the 4th 1834
this day first part a strong gale from
the S.W. steered to the S.E. till 11 P.M. the
wind lulled and haled to the S.E. one more
ship to the S.W. and made sail
the watch imployed till ware? John?
So ends this day 497

Friday May the 5th 1834
this day pleasant weather wind from the
S.E. till 1 P.M. heard it was the hauled to the S.E.
on the long & steered to the S.W. 12 M
tacked to the N.W. under full sail till
3 P.M. tacked to the S.W. & till tacked to
the N.E. till 9 M tacked to the S.
the watch imployed till ware? John?
So ends this day 498

Saturday May the 6th 1834
this day pleasant weather with a strong wind
from the E. till 9 P.M. tacked to the N.W. and
shortened sail till 8 P.M. tacked to the S.W. and
made sail till 4 P.M. saw a shoal of 8 P.
wholly land & boats the whales were at
gain very quick did not get up with the
the boats returned to the ship till 6 P.M.
So ends this day the E Cape of New Zealand
harbour & about 100 M. the New Zealand bay 499

Sunday May the 6th 1834
this day pleasant weather till 11 P.M. tacked ship
to the N. and shortened sail till 9 P.M. tacked
to the S.E. and made sail till 4 P.M. saw the
East Cape of New Zealand having S.E. Dist
60 Miles the wind was from the off in our
favor we steered to the E under full sail 6 M.
So ends this day 500

Monday May the 7th 1834
this day commenced with pleasant weather steered
to the E by the wind till 6 P.M. the E Cape
of New Zealand bore S.W. Dist 4 Leagues and
the wind hauled to the N.W. and increased
till 9 P.M. steered to the S.E. till 4 P.M. saw a
large shoal of whales land & boats and saw
them it was a large shoal the whales were quite
very quick did not get on returned to the ship
till 9 P.M. So ends this day 501
