saw the land bearing S.W. the wind hauled  
to the S.W. I did it and it was lashed  
ship to the S.E. and made all sail at  
11 A.M. on bent the main top sail and  
bent it rather  
So ends this day

Saturday May the 20th 1894 Days out 614  
this day a strong gale from the S.W. and squally  
weather very rough made and shortened sail  
at 10 A.M. required at 4 P.M. saw a night whaler going  
back to the mainland at Merina split the main sail  
So ends this day Satt quite long

Sunday May the 21st 1894 Days out 615  
this day light winds and calms made and  
shortened sail at 10 A.M. on bent the  
main sail and bent it rather  
So ends this day

Tuesday May the 22nd 1894 Days out 616  
this day a strong wind from the N.W. at 11 A.M. touched  
to the S. at 1 P.M. more to the S.W. at 4 P.M. made all sail  
So ends this day

Wednesday May the 23rd 1894 Days out 617  
this day first part strong winds steady wind & fine  
but at 1 P.M. gale from the N.W. hauled to the S.W.  
under short sail at 4 P.M. more ship to the S.W.  
and made sail at 6 P.M. hauled on heavy and we were  
forced to shorten sail and hauled off shore  
So ends this day

Thursday May the 24th 1894 Days out 618  
this day no wind at 1 P.M. began to  
sto down oil in the blubber room at 4 P.M.  
got them stoving the watch in place and  
So ends this day

Friday May the 25th 1894 Days out 619  
this day a pleasant day at 6 P.M. saw the S.E. point  
of the hauled head hauled West at 10 P.M. steamed  
to the S.W. under all sail  
So ends this day

Saturday May the 26th 1894 Days out 620  
this day light winds and calms the sun shined  
up in the air and we lay at anchor of the  
bay of Akhson in which we were bound we  
find it difficult to find it to make all  
strangers here the wind being us in it  
calm and a heavy swell from the N.W. at 11 A.M.  
on shore very hard we were forced to  
the boat at 1 P.M. to find the ship of shore  
and tied 3 or 4 hours and then got out clear of  
the land took a boat and steamed to the S.W. at 4 P.M.  
spoke the landing command of Bristol at 11 A.M.  
at 2 P.M. hauled up oil found in the bay touched and  
stood in under all sail the waves from the N.W.  
touched to the  
So ends this day

Sunday May the 27th 1894 Days out 621  
this day we anchored weather steamed in for  
hauled head until 3 P.M. then touched to the  
S.W. with a strong wind until 11 P.M.  
then put the ship on the other tack and  
stood in and shortened sail at 1 P.M. saw the  
other ship in shore we steamed on with it strong  
wind got in with the land had it calm  
So ends this day

Monday May the 28th 1894  
this day a strong gale from the N.W. at 12 P.M.  
the boat went to the landing on shore  
and it shot in foggy and it calm did not  
get it hand until 4 P.M. the ship got sight  
of each other by the sound of guns to boat
