

Remarks on board of the ship *Paladina*
 Wednesday February 15th
 All this day light wind from the west and
 pleasant weather steering S by W, bent the
 fore topgallant sail sent out the fly jib boom
 Lat 6. 06 S
 Long 178. 00 W

Thursday February 16th
 All this day light wind from west or calm
 steering S by W. thick hazy weather
 Lat 6. 06 S
 Long 178. 11 W

Friday February 17th
 First & middle parts a light wind from
 the west by south and pleasant weather
 steering S by W. Latter part a strong wind
 from the S by W. course S W. Saw a Brig
 steering to the SE, saw many flocks of black fish
 Lat 6. 06 S
 Long 178. 11 W

Saturday February 18th
 First part a strong breeze from the S by W attended
 with pleasant weather course S by W, saw a ship and
 blackfish at 12 past 3 o'clock saw the Island of Juan
 Fernandez at 3 o'clock ship to the SE, and double
 reefed the topsails, middle part the same
 Latter part sent a boat on shore
 Lat 6. 06 S
 Long 178. 50 W

Sunday February 20th
 All this day a light wind from the SE and
 some rain at 2 P.M. the boat returned with a
 lot of fish, the Captain went on shore at 4 returned
 with a small pig and 2 geese, there were 5 or 6
 living on the Island. Middle & Latter part the
 weather the same course S by W
 Lat 6. 06 S
 Long 178. 50 W

Bround down the coast of Chile at 1872
 Monday February 21st

All this day a light breeze from the SE attended with
 cloudy weather at 5 o'clock saw several whales lower
 our boat but it was dark before we could get
 near them they were going quick to the windward
 came on board and stood to the eastward at
 6 o'clock went to the westward
 Lat 6. 06 S
 Long 178. 50 W



Tuesday 22nd
 All this day a light wind or calm from the
 westward steering to the northward, at 10 o'clock
 saw a shoal of sperm whales. lowered the boat
 but they were very shy we could not get fast



Wednesday 23rd
 All this day a strong breeze from the west
 the boat a chasing whales at sunset they came
 on board and shortened sail. Saw the ship
 Elizabeth Starbuck of Canton Capt. Biglow
 6 months out with 120 barrels
 Lat 6. 06 S
 Long 179. 00 W

Thursday 24th
 All this day the wind from the S and W
 heading to the SE at 8 o'clock left off S by W
 this day spoke the ship Howard of Canton
 4 months out with 10 barrels of oil Bunker
 master
 Lat 6. 06 S
 Long 179. 30 W
