

Remarks on board of the Ship *Balaena*
Sunday March the 20th 1842
All this day light trades attended with pleasant
weather steering W & N.

Long " 67.4

Tuesday the 21st
All this day light trades & pleasant weather
Course W & N

Lat by Obs 4.45 S

Wednesday the 22nd
All this day light air or calm steering W by S

Lat by Obs
Long by Chron

Wednesday the 23rd

All this day light trades & pleasant weather
steering West. At sunset took in sail &
stood to the Southwest until day light and then
made sail steering W & N

Lat by Obs 2.56 S
Long by Chron 87.24 W

Thursday the 24th
First and middle parts fresh trades & cloudy
steering W & N, latter part light air or calm
Lat by Obs 2.04 S

Friday the 25th
All this day light air or calm steering to
the S & W, At noon saw Trade Island bearing
by compass S W 15 miles dist

bound towards the *Gallapagos Islands*
Saturday March the 26th 1842
All this day light air or calm attended with
pleasant weather. At noon Charles Island bore
West 11 miles dist

Sunday March the 27th
First part a light air from the N & W. at 3 AM
saw Blackfish toward the South and caught one
At sunset Charles Island bore W by N 10 miles dist
Middle & latter parts light air steering to the
S & W.

Lat by Obs 1.58 South
Long by Chron 90.10 West

Monday the 28th
All this day light winds from the South steering
to the South, at 3 PM tacked to the S & W
No ship in sight

Lat by Obs 2.20 South
Long " Chron 91.46 West

Tuesday the 29th
All this day a light air from the West or calm
steering to the S & W

Lat by Obs 2.01 South
Long by Chron 91.50 West

Wednesday the 30th
All this day a calm and pleasant weather

Lat by Obs 2.34 South
Long " Chron 92.40 West

Thursday the 31st
First part calm, Middle & latter parts baffling
winds & raining attended with thunder & lightning
