All this day light winds & pleasant weather

Wednesday 29th
All this day strong winds & pleasant weather saw a ship
Lat by obs 3. 37. S
Long " Chro 115. 33. W

Thursday 30th
All this day strong winds & smoky weather with some rain
Lat by obs 4. 08. S
Long " Chro 115. 23. W

Friday July 1st
First and middle parts strong winds with squalls of rain, at 4 P.M. spoke the ship Marcus of N. Haven Capt Boad 19 months out 950 bbls of Sperme, latter part pleasant weather
Lat by obs 2. 43. S
Long " Chro 114. 15. W

Saturday 2nd
First and middle part light winds & pleasant weather, employed at repairing the main top gallant sails, latter part strong winds & squally with rain, at 10 P.M. spoke the ship Sabine Gibbs of N. Haven
Lat by obs 1. 18. S

Sunday 3rd
First part fresh winds & thick weather middle & latter parts fresh winds & pleasant saw a ship standing to the Southward
Lat by obs 1. 55. S
Long by Chro 112. 46. W

Monday 4th
All this day fresh winds & pleasant weather steering to the Southward
Lat by obs 3. 53. S
Long " Chro 113. 28. W

Tuesday July 5th 1842
First part fresh breezes & pleasant weather steering by the middle & latter part strong winds & thick weather, at 10 A.M. saw a shoal of sperm whales going to the N.W. towards the boats in chase so ens

Wednesday 6th L.B.
All this day fresh winds & pleasant weather at 1 P.M. the Boat came on board the whales galley, at 2 lowered the quarter Boats and at 6 took one along side Lat by obs 4. 33. S
Saw a ship to N.W.

Thursday 7th
All this day light breezes and pleasant weather, at 2 P.M. finished cutting at 4 commenced boiling, at 8 A.M. saw ship to the South, saw a ship

Friday 8th
First part fresh winds & pleasant weather middle & latter parts squally, at 11 P.M. finished boiling & washed off, saw a ship
Lat by obs 4. 32. S
Long " Chro 114. 46. W

Saturday 9th
All this day squally weather employed at cooping lib for stowing, saw a ship
Lat

Sunday 10th
All this day strong winds & squally weather at 10 A.M. took in sail and backed ship to the South, saw a ship Lat by obs 4. 27. S
Long " Chro 114. 39. W

Monday 11th
All this day strong winds & squally with a very rough sea, on, at 4 P.M. spoke the ship Jaffan of Nant Capt Kinball 9 months out 200 bbls, at 7 A.M. backed to the N.W.
Lat by obs 4. 57. S
