

Remarks on board of Ship

Friday January 20th 1843
All this day fine breeze & pleasant steering
West, at 6 P.M. saw Moody Island bearing South.
Latter part steering for Nahuzo at noon the
Islands of Nahuzo bore West dist 4 miles
Lat by obs 8.58 S
Long by Chro 148.05

Saturday January 21st
Lying off & on at Nahuzo at 10 A.M.
At noon kept off for Neukahion. At 6 P.M.
the Capt went on shore at 11 returned and
kept off for Statute.

Sunday January 22nd
All this day fine breeze & pleasant steering
N.W. with all drawing sail set
Lat by obs 9.34 S
Long by Chro 148.25 W

Monday January 23rd
All this day fine breeze & pleasant weather
steering N.W. with all sails out
Lat by obs 9.42 S
Long by Chro 142.13 W

Tuesday January 24th
All this day fine breeze & pleasant
weather steering S.W. by W with all sail
out the wind from the N.E.
Lat by obs 10.43 S
Long by Chro 144.11 W

Wednesday January 25th
All this day strong breeze & squally
with rain & steering S.W. without all sail
out. Employed at various jobs about the rigging
Lat by obs 11.04 S
Long by Chro 146.10 W

Balaena & Manchester Master
Thursday January 25th 1843
All this day fresh breeze from
the East steering S.W. by W. with all sail
out. Employed about the rigging
Lat by obs 14.04 S
Long by Chro 148.05

Friday January 26th
First part pleasant breeze from the East
steering S.W. by W. At 6 A.M. saw the Land
At 8 A.M. set took in the topgallant
sails & fly gibo. At 8 hauled up the courses
& wore ship to the North. Middle part squally
At 2 P.M. wore ship to the S.E. & lay aback.
Until 4 A.M. & P.M. the West point bore S.S.E. 4 miles
Dist latter part steering S.W. by W. At 10 saw
the land. At noon misty. At 1 P.M. compass S.E. dist
15.34 S
Long by Chro 148.25 W

Saturday January 27th
All this day light winds from the N.E.
& pleasant weather, steering S.W. by W. & S.W. by S
with all sails out. At noon saw Statute
bearing for compass S.W. by W. Further bore West
Lat by obs 16.58 S

Sunday January 28th
All this day squally with rain or calm
steering in for the Harbore, at three point
saw Don S. dist 5 miles

Monday January 29th
Light breeze & pleasant, at 5 A.M. took
the pilot at 5 came to anchor at Sabata
Ships at anchor one French man of war,
30 guns one English 24 guns, one 3rd American
merchant, whale ships, Java of St. Johns of P.
Edward of Hudson, blue pitched of P.
L. C. Richards of P.B., Maria Theres of P.B.,
Clippers wayne of Fairhaven, Dark Wilkesburg
of N.B., Peruvian of St. Johns N.B., one French
man of war 14 guns.
