

Remarks on board of the
 Friday March 24th 1843
 All this day fine breeze & pleasant
 weather steering to the North. At sun
 set tacked to the South. Latter part
 steering to the SW. Saw nothing of the
 whale kind Lat by obs 18° 18' S
 Long " Chro 178° 03' W

Saturday 25th
 All this day fine breeze & pleasant
 weather steering to the Southwest. Saw porpoises
 Lat by obs 18° 26' S
 Long " Chro 178° 40' E

Sunday 26th
 All this day fine breeze & pleasant
 weather steering West. At sun set shortened
 sail & steered S. Latter part steering
 West with all sail out
 Lat by obs 18° 52' S
 Long " Chro 177° 42' E

Monday 27th
 All this day fine breeze & pleasant
 weather steering West. At sun set shortened
 sail & steered South. At day light saw
 Hope Island bearing W by N dist 10 miles
 At 8 P.M. saw sperm whales lowering the
 boats but the canoes frightened them
 & they went quick to the windward
 At 10 the boats came on board & stood to
 the North
 Lat by obs
 Long " Chro

Ship Salinas Captain R. Manchester
 Tuesday March 28th 1843
 All this day light winds & cloudy
 standing to the South. At 4 A.M. the
 canoes came off with H. & M. to
 trade for tobacco. At 3 P.M. tacked
 to the North. At 8. Saw sperm whales
 lowering the boats at 12 took one to the
 ship. Hope Island NNE, dist 15 miles
 SB

Wednesday 29th
 All this day fine weather. At 6 A.M.
 finished cutting. At 2 P.M. wore ship
 to the North & commenced voyaging
 Lat by obs
 Long " Chro

Thursday 30th
 All this day strong breeze & some
 squally steering to the North. At 5 A.M.
 tacked to the South. At 2 P.M. wore ship
 to the North finished voyaging. At 8.
 Saw Ratchet Island bearing NNE dist 12 miles
 At noon the land Lat by obs 24° 15' S
 bore West dist 5 miles Long " Chro 176° 11' E

Friday 31st
 All this day fresh breeze & pleasant
 steering by the wind to the SE. At 12 midnight
 tacked to the North. At 10 P.M. saw Ratchet
 Island. At noon bore ENE dist 10 miles
 Lat by obs 24° 6' S
 Long " Chro
