

Remarks on board of the
 Tuesday April 18th 1843
 All this day light winds & pleasant
 weather sailing for the Land in company
 with the George & Susan. At 3 AM spoke
 her & buffed to the wind heading SE the
 land bearing SW dist 10 miles latitude by
 obs 44 miles south, Long by Chron 165.54E
 At 2 AM were ship to the North,
 at day light kept off for the land,
 at 7 the Captain went on shore at noon
 came on board, Land 3 miles dist

Wednesday 19th
 Light winds & pleasant weather steering
 WNW, in company with the George & Susan
 Middle & Latter part sailing NW by W
 Employed at Coopers Bay Lat by obs 2.48N
 Long by Chron 165.31E

Thursday 20th
 Light winds & pleasant weather steering
 NW by W, in company with the George &
 Susan, at 5 PM saw sperm whales towards
 the boats, but it being so late could not
 catch them. Middle & Latter part
 steering NW by W Lat by obs
 Long by Chron

Friday 21st
 All this day fine weather in com-
 pany with the George & Susan,
 at 1 PM saw sperm whales toward
 the boats & caught 2 of them
 Latter part cut them up
 Lat by obs 1.30N
 Long by Chron 166.00E



Ship Balaena Capt. R. Manchester
 Saturday April 22nd 1843
 All this day fine weather, employed at
 boiling, saw by sail to the Westward
 Latter part finished boiling
 Lat by obs 0.00N
 Long by Chron 165.50E

Sunday 23rd
 First & Middle parts fine weather
 steering to the N & West Latter part
 rainy No obs this day

Monday 24th
 First & Middle parts baffling winds
 & rainy, course NW by W, Latter part
 calm saw porpoise Lat by obs 3.50N
 Long by Chron 163.

Tuesday 25th
 First part calm Middle & Latter
 parts light winds & pleasant, course
 NW by W, employed at catching the
 main tigger Lat by obs 04.12N
 Long by Chron

Wednesday 26th
 First & Middle parts light winds &
 rainy steering NW. At 6 AM saw the
 land. In aloft Island Latter part pleasant
 employed at catching the main tigger
 at noon the land bore E by S dist 20 m

Thursday 27th
 All this day strong breeze & clear
 by of rain. At sun set double reefed
 the top sails Middle part steering
 WNW Latter part made sail steering
 NW by W, at 9 AM saw Magaskilla Island
 at noon bore for compass East dist. 8 miles
 Magaskilla Island
