

Remarks on board Sunday May 28th 1843

All this day fresh winds from the South & pleasant weather steering W & W. Stowed 40 Bbls of oil in the main hold saw a plenty of fin backs & porpoises.

Monday the 29th
All this day strong winds from the S & W & cloudy. Steering by the wind to the West saw fin backs.

Lat by obs 30.30, N
Long " Chro 149.00, W

Tuesday the 30th
All this day squally rain & weather from the S & W. At sun set double reefed & tacked to the S & W. Saw fin backs & porpoises.

Wednesday the 31st
All this day light winds from the S & W & rainy. Saw fin backs & porpoises.

Thursday June 1st 1843
All this day strong winds with much rain steering to the westward. At sun set double reefed the top sails. At 9- luffed to the wind heading S & W. Wind S & W. Luffed part steering S & W this day.

Friday 2nd
All this day strong gale & much rain from the North. Luffed to the wind heading S & W. Took in the 4th Mizzen top sails & courses & lost the main. At 8 P.M. a sea boarded us which drove us part of the weather bulwarks took in the main top sail & wore ship to the North West.

Saturday 3rd
All this day strong gale & rainy from the Northward. At 12 P.M. luffed all hands wore ship Eastward & luffed up the Starboard boat with heavy sea running.

Sunday 4th
First part the gale more moderate middle & latter part moderate breezes & fine weather. Made sail steering S & W.

Monday 5th
All this day fine breeze from the S & W & pleasant. Steering to the South West. Saw nothing of the whale line.

Tuesday 6th
First part light winds from the S. Steering by the wind to the South. Middle & latter part wind strong from the North steering by the wind heading S. Lat by obs 28.58, N
