Wednesday July 19th 1843
All this day fine weather steering to the
N E by the wind. Employed at stowing
down oil in the after hold

Thursday 20th
All this day strong winds & pleasant
weather at 8 P.M. tacked to the south
finished the stowing down, saw fairbacks
Lat by obs 31° 04' N
Long " Chro 151° 16' E

Friday 21st
All this day strong winds & pleasant
weather steering by the wind to the south
saw a ship steering to the North
Lat by obs 28° 53' N
Long " Chro 156° 38' E

Saturday 22^d
First part light winds and pleasant
weather steering to the south, saw
a ship standing to the N E showing
a blue signal with a letter O in it
middle & latter part strong winds steering
to the Eastward
Lat by obs 28° 55' N
Long " Chro 151° 40' E

Sunday 23^d
All this day strong breezes & passing
clouds saw a ship steering to the S W
showing a signal, at 6 A.M. tacked to the
south saw nothing of the whale kind
Lat by obs 30° 06' N
Lat of 2nd boat 29° 12' N
Long by Chro 158° 00' E
Long " Sinar 157° 23' E

Ship Baraona 1843

Monday July 24th
All this day strong breezes & squally with
rain, at 12th tacked ship to the North
latter steering to S W. wind from the S E
saw nothing of the whale kind
Lat by obs
Long "

Tuesday 25th
All this day strong winds & pleasant
weather steering to the N E, wind from S E
at 6 A.M. spoke the ship United States
of Nant of the Captain of Sars, exchanged
signals with the ship showing a red signal
with a letter E in it, at noon heaved
to the wind bearing to the N E
Lat by obs 31° 28' N
Long "

Wednesday 26th
All this day strong breezes &
pleasant weather steering to the North
at 8 A.M. tacked to South, latter part
steering to the S E by the wind
1 ship in sight
Lat by obs 30° 06' N
Long " Chro

Thursday 27th
All this day fine pleasant weather
wind from the East, at 6 P.M. spoke
the ship Lyda of Nant 35 months out
1400 bbls. at 11 saw a wreck to the windward
2 ships in sight
Lat 30° 04' N
Long "

Friday 28th
Fine weather, at 2 P.M. saw a shoal of
large gobules going slow to the S W toward
the boats, 1 board Boat Imp. A, at 8 came
on board, 3 ships in sight latter part
saw the Lyda a cutter
Lat by obs 30° 04' Long 156° 00'
