 Thursday Aug 10th
 All this day strong winds from
 the south, steering E by S. at 3 P.M.
 Spoke the Bark Canton with 900 Bbls
 at 11 saw whales at noon lowered
 the boats 1 ship in sight.
 Sat by Obs 29,06

Friday 11th
 Strong breezes & pleasant the in
 chase of whales struck 3 parted from
 2, at 3 P.M. took one along side of
 cut him in middle part. Cleared away
 the head, at 7 A.M. saw more whales
 lowered the boat at 12 past 7 struck
 one, at 11 took him along side and
 commenced boiling, several ships in sight
 Sat by Obs 29,06
 Long " Chro 171,5836



Saturday 12th
 Strong winds & very rough sea
 Employed at boiling at 7 P.M. cooled
 down & commenced cutting at noon
 the head off

Sunday 13th
 Strong wind & very rough sea on
 Employed at cutting, at 2 P.M. parted
 from the head at 5 got the body in
 & the head along side again middle
 part boiling latter part took the
 head in saw 3 ships one of them the
 Three Brothers, & boiling

 Monday August 14th
 All this day rough & employed at boiling
 saw 3 ships
 No obs this day

Tuesday 15th
 Light breezes & pleasant weather
 at noon finished boiling
 No Obs this day

Wednesday 16th
 Moderate breezes & pleasant weather
 with a heavy rain employed
 at cooping Sat by Obs 29,00 N
 Long " Chro 172,118

Thursday 17th
 All this day fine pleasant weather
 employed at cooping and stowing
 down, at 2 P.M. saw whales lowered
 the boat at 4 took one along side
 middle part lay with him along side
 at day light commenced cutting at 9 finished
 saw another ship amongst whales
 at noon lowered our boats 3 ships in
 sight



Friday 18th
 Fresh winds & pleasant the boats off
 & chasing whales at sun set came on
 board the whales very shy 2 ships in
 sight
 Employed at boiling Sat by Obs 28,50, N



Saturday 19th
 All this day fine weather employed at
 boiling, at 4 A.M. finished latter part stowing
 down
