Friday Dec 8th 1843
First & Middle parts heavy squalls with
rain, Latter part baffling winds & cloudy
Lat by Obs 14.13, N

Saturday 9th
First part light winds from the SSE
& pleasant weather steering to the Eastward
Middle & Latter part light breeze from the
East steering South
Lat by Obs 13.45, N
Long " Chro 105.40, W

Sunday 10th
First part light air from the Eastward
& fine weather steering South, Middle and
Latter parts heading S by W Lat by Obs 12.04, N

Monday 11th
First part fresh breeze from the E & pleasant
weather steering S by E South, Middle and Latter
parts steering SSE with a strong wind
Lat by Obs 9.35, N

Tuesday 12th
First & Middle parts strong winds from
the East & pleasant, Latter part squally
with rain steering S by E Lat by Obs 6.57, N
Long " Chro 105.44, W

Wednesday 13th
All this day squally with rain steering
S by W with all sail out
Lat by Obs 7.53, N

Ship Bakeria Capt^m Manchester
Thursday Dec 14th 1843
All this day strong winds from the Eastward
& squally with rain steering to the South west
Saw fin back
Lat by Obs 3.50, N

Friday 15th
First part strong winds & cloudy steering by the
wind heading SE, Middle part & Latter parts
squally
Lat by Obs 2.30, N
Long " Chro 109.16, W

Saturday 16th
All this day strong winds & pleasant
weather steering by the wind heading S by E
Lat by Obs 02.58, N

Sunday 17th
All this day strong winds & smoky weather
steering by the wind to the South
Lat by Obs 9.15, S

Monday 18th
First part strong winds & smoky weather
steering by the wind to the South, At 1/2 past
5 P.M. saw a shoal of sperm whales lower the
boats but it being too late to catch them,
Middle part more moderate at 11 tacked
to the E by S, At 7 AM tacked to the South
Lat by Obs 2.20, S
Long " Chro 113.05, W

Tuesday 19th
First part fresh breeze & pleasant weather
steering by the wind to the South, saw
fin backs, Middle & Latter part much the
same
Lat by Obs 4.17, S
