Monday January 1st 1844

All this day strong winds & pleasant weather, saw a ship to the westward
Lat

Tuesday 2^d
All this day strong winds & cloudy
Spoke the ship *Chero* of Nantucket
28 months out with 400 Bbls of sperm
Lat by obs 20, 3
Long " *Chero* 112, 20

Wednesday 3^d
All this day strong winds & squally,
employed Lat. repairing sails, saw
2 ships
Lat by obs 16, 3
Long " *Chero* 123, 16

Thursday 4th
All this day strong winds & cloudy
Saw nothing of the whale kind
Lat by obs 16, 20
Long " *Chero* 124, 40



Friday 5th
All this day strong winds & pleasant weather, saw nothing of the whale kind.
Lat by obs 10, 3
Long " *Chero* 125, 50

Saturday 6th
All this day strong winds & pleasant weather, saw a ship standing to the south, saw Blackfish
Lat by obs 10, 30

Sunday January 7th
All this day strong breeze & pleasant weather, saw nothing of the whale kind
Lat by obs 2, 0, 3
Long " *Chero* 128, 28

Monday 8th
All this day fine breeze & pleasant weather, saw nothing but porpoises
Lat by obs 00, 32
Long " *Chero* 130, 02

Tuesday 9th
All this day fine breeze & pleasant weather, at 8 AM saw sperm whales at 4 lower the Boats this day, 2 Boats fast
Lat by obs 00, 00

Wednesday 10th
First part the Boats off after whales at 3 PM took 2 along side, at 5 lower for more at 6 took another along side Middle part laying by the whales heading to the north Latter part cut them in saw a ship to the eastward
Lat by obs 00, 15

Thursday 11th
All this day fine weather, employed at clearing away the hoar, at 3 PM saw sperm whales lower the Boats & took 2 along side, Middle & Latter parts laying with them along side at noon called down & commenced cutting, saw a ship
