to Nahzag, at noon Nahzag bore E by S
dist 10 miles

Monday 19th
All this day pleasant weather, beating
up to Nahzag, trading for Hogs

Tuesday 20th
Sailing off Nahzag, trading
for Hogs in the south side of the
Island

Wednesday 21st
First part squally with rain
at 3 PM the Boat came on board
got off 11 Hogs & Boat loads of Bread
quilt, Coon nuts & Bananas
Middle part standing to the
Satter part to the

Thursday 22nd
First & Middle part light winds
& pleasant weather, steering by the
wind to the North, at 8 AM tacked
to the E. Latter part fine weather
Saw nothing of the whale ring
Saw by the 13th of 1844

Friday 23rd
All this day fine breeze & pleasant
weather, steering by the wind to the
S. at Sun set tacked to the North
at 7 AM spoke the Ship Columbia
of Nantucket 30 miles out 1300 lbs

smoky weather, some rain, at 3 AM
wiped ship to the South, Saw one
Himback
Saw by the 13th of 1844

All this day light wind & smoky
weather, with a heavy swell from the
N.W. steering South, saw no ships steering
North. Saw Himbacks & Porpoises
Saw by the 13th of 1844
