 First part strong breezes & cloudy, Middle
 & latter parts light winds & pleasant
 weather, steering to the North
 Lat by Obs 3.50.3
 Long " Chro 176.05

Wednesday 17th
 All this day light airs or calms
 steering to the NW, Saw nothing worthy
 of remarks Lat by Obs 3.32.3

Thursday 18th
 All this day light baffling winds &
 squally with rain, steering to the NW
 Lat by Obs 3.23.3
 Long " Chro 177.35.4

Ship Balena Capt R. Monchale
 Friday April 19th 1844
 All this day light winds & fine
 pleasant weather, steering to the Northward
 at 1/2 past 9 AM Saw a large Sperm
 whale lowered the boat this day ended
 in chase of a whale, Lat by Obs 2.48.3
 Long " Chro 177.02

Saturday 20th
 First part light airs very pleasant
 at 1 PM the Starboard boat got fast
 at 2 took him along side and took
 his jaw in, Middle & latter part fine
 weather, at noon finished cutting
 Lat by Obs 3.15.3
 Long " Chro 177.15.3

Sunday 21st
 All this day fine breezes & pleasant
 weather steering to the North under
 easy sails, Employed at boiling
 Lat by Obs 3.15.3

Monday 22nd
 All this day fine breezes & pleasant
 weather, steering by the wind to the
 North, Employed at boiling
 Lat by Obs 3.15.3

Tuesday 23rd
 All this day fine breezes & pleasant weather
 at 8 PM finished boiling turned up
 100 lbs, Middle & latter parts steering
 to the SW Lat by Obs 3.15.3
 Long " Chro 177.50.3
