the North steering East took in the fore and
mizzen top sails & jib. Spoke the ship
Edward Cary of Nant 33 months out 1200 Bbls
No Obp this day

Friday 31st
First part strong gales from the S.W.
& thick foggy weather. At 4 P.M. set the
fore & mizzen topsails steering E by N.
Middle part pleasant weather. Latter part
cloudy steering E.N.E. the E. Cary in sight.
Lat by altitudinal altitude of the Moon
at 12 P.M. 30.30. N. Long by Chron 162.16 E

Saturday June 1st 1844
All this day strong breezes & cloudy
weather steering E by N. Lat by Obs 30.04. N
Long by Chron 164.55

Sunday 2^d
All this day strong winds & cloudy
weather steering East latter part E.S.E.
wind to the Northward Lat by Obs 29.13. N
Long by Chron 165.56 E

Monday 3^d
All this day strong winds from the N.E.
& cloudy weather, steering by the wind to
Eastward Lat by Obs 28.18. N

Tuesday 4th
First part strong winds & very rugged
at 8 P.M. wore ship to the North middle
& latter part light breezes from the N.E.
and smoky, saw nothing but all
Lat by Obs 27.07. N
Long by Chron 167.45 E

Ship Batavia, Captain Manchester
Wednesday June 5th 1844
All this day light winds from the N.E. &
foggy weather steering to the N.W.
Saw a ship standing to the S.W.

Thursday 6th
First part light breezes & smoky weather
& sails in light, at 3 P.M. spoke Bark
Damon of N. Port 20 months out 400
Latter part strong breezes from N.W.
steering East Lat by Obs 30.07. N
Long by Chron 167.16 E

Friday 7th
All this day strong breezes from the N.W.
& cloudy weather steering to the N.E.
in company with the Damon
Lat by Obs 30.50. N
Long by Chron 169.08 E

Saturday 8th
All this day strong winds & rugged
weather Lat by Obs 29.51. N

Sunday 9th
All this day strong winds & rugged
weather Lat by Obs 28.44. N
Long by Chron 170.09 E

Monday 10th
All this day strong winds & rugged
weather No Obp

Tuesday 11th
All this day strong winds & rugged
weather, at 8 P.M. spoke ship Herald
of N.B. 11 months out 400 sperm
