First part Strong winds, latter part light winds & pleasant weather

Thursday 13th

All this day light winds & pleasant weather

Lat by obs 29.20
Long " Chro 111.36.6

Friday 14th

All this day light winds & cloudy weather
2 Sails in sight Lat by obs 29.45.0

Saturday 15th

All this day light winds and cloudy at 7 P.M. spoke the Ship from of 33 months out 1500, at 11 o'clock saw sperm whales & killed the Boatman whale



Sunday 16th

All this day cloudy foggy weather at 3 P.M. took the whale along side, at 4 began to cut at 7 all in latter part cleared away the head and began to boil

Monday 17th

All this day fresh breezes & cloudy weather. Saw 2 Ships. Lat by obs 31.22.0

Tuesday 18th

All this day moderate breezes & foggy weather, at 7 P.M. finished boiling turned up 54 lbs Lat by obs 31.28.0

Friday 21st

All this day light airs & calm and pleasant weather, Saw nothing but finbacks Lat by obs

Saturday 22nd

All this day light airs & calm weather, Employed at repairing the 1st Sail Lat

Sunday 23rd

All this day light breezes and pleasant weather Saw nothing of the whale kind Lat by obs 31.10.0

Monday 24th

All this day Strong winds & cloudy weather, Saw nothing of the whale kind picked up a part of a Chinese vessel Lat by obs 30.37.0

Long " Chro 117.05

Tuesday 25th

First part moderate breeze & cloudy weather steering to the eastward, exchanged signals with the Ship Hero of Hunt. At 4 P.M. spoke the Ship Saint Robertson of N.B. 33 months out 1100 lbs sperm Lat
