

Remarks on board of the

Saturday Nov 23rd 1844

Light winds from the N.E. Steering
by the winds to the E. At 8 AM Saw
3 Right whales, lowered the boats and
struck both the Cow sunk at 12, took
the calf to the ship Lat by Obs 38° 00' S
SB, 12 Long. " Chro 157° 00' W



Sunday 24th

Light winds and Cloudy, Calm. The whale
and commenced boiling, at 1 PM saw another
Right whale lowered but could not get on

Monday 25th

First part baffling wind and rough employed
at boiling, at 2 PM saw three Right whales
lowered the boats and caught one at 4 took
him to the ship, latter part cut him in.

Saturday March 1st 1845

All this day fine weather wind from the West
Course 94 W. At 9 AM. saw sperm whales, at 11 lowered
the boats and struck one. Lat by Obs 38° 59' S
Long. " Chro 89° 52' W

Sunday 2nd

Fine breeze from N.W. and cloudy at 3 PM took
the whale along side. at sunset had the body
in, at day light took the head in. saw a
ship to the North is cutting. Lat by Obs.
Long. " Chro
