Friday 14th Spent the day Strong gails from W N W to W with light showers of Rain Steering E S E by Compass Lat obs 38 10⁰ N Long by Chronometer at 12 30 P M 60-56 W
2^d out.

Saturday 15th Begins with Strong gails from West which brought us under double reefed top sails all hands Employed in fitting Boats and Ships Duty Steering E S E middle part Strong gails took in the fore and main top sails latter part more moderate Set the top sails fore and main Lat obs 37, 50 N Long Chronometer 60-38

Sunday 16th Begins with Strong gails from W S W Steering E by S all hands Employed in fitting Boats & Day Ends with fine weather Wind at North Lat obs 37 55 N West Long Chronometer 55-38

Monday 17th Begins with fine weather Wind at North Steering E by S latter part Calm Day passed in repairs Lat obs 37-58 N Long Chronometer 52, 10 W

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Tuesday 18th Begins with light breezes from S W Steering E by South all hands Employed in fitting y day and boats & Ship's duty Day ends with Wind at West Lat obs 38 41 N

Wednesday 19th Begins with Wind at West all hands employed in Ship's duty Steering E by S middle and latter part Wind at S E Steering by E S E Lat obs 38 38 N Long by Chronometer at 12 P M 48-25 W

Thursday 20th Begins with fine breezes from S E Steering E S E all hands employed in fitting Boats and Ship's duty One hand of duty Sick and the Second mate very unwell though not well out Day Ends with Strong breezes from S E Lat obs 39 10 N

Friday 21st Begins with Strong gails from S W Steering E S E at 4 P M Tove to under the main Top Sail & for top mast Stay Sail at 8 P M more moderate Set the fore sail at 3 A M went on deck found hatched of it blowing a heavy gale and darty head sea. Took in fore sail and broke main top mast on Boat all mast all the pieces
