saw the boat and killed him

Thursday 22nd begins with pleasant weather
at 3 P m got the whale long side
at 4 begin to cut
at 5 P m make all fast for the
night head half off
Through the night fine weather

at meridian got in the body and joints

Friday 23rd begins with fine weather and light
Winds from SE
Employed in Baillins the Caise
at 11 P m begin to boil
at 4 A m strong gales from South
killed one of the men John Boyell
badly scolded he was cleaning out
the boiler and one of the men
saw moving him to be their
Baillied some oil on him
Lat obs 32° 54' South

Saturday 24th first part strong breezes from South
heaving to the West
middle part light breeze from the same
latter part Calm
Employed in boiling
Lat obs 32° 54' South
Long by Lunet at 9 A m 48° 48' West
Long by Chronometer at 5 49 49 West

Sunday 25th begins with fine weather and Calm
at 11 P m finished Boiling
saw porpoises
78 days out I am in hopes to get one more sick whale
this side the Land but don't expect
latter part fine breezes from WNW
Steering SW by S by Compass
Latitude 32° 48' South
Long by Lunet at 9 A m
48° 03' W

Monday 26th first part strong breezes from NW
Steering SW by S by Compass
latter part light breeze from SSW
Weather cloudy Employed in storing down
oil. Balance Sails Lat obs 32° 58' South
