thick weather with some Rain
at 3 A M Double Reefed top sail
wind at Wind WSW
Lat obs 49° 23' South

Tuesday
24th

109° out

through the day strong breeze from
NW & WSW
at 4 A M Lake Brig Balise
from New York bound to the
NW Coast got out
day ends with thick foggy weather
Wind NW

Wednesday
25th

110° out

begins with heavy gails from
NW at 4 P M have to
through the night stars heavy
at 4 A M more moderate made sail
Wind at SW day ends with
fine weather Lat obs 46° 41' South
Long by Chronometer at 3 P M
77° 42' West

Thursday
26th

111° out

1832
begins with fine weather Wind SW
steering NW by S
saw porpoises and fin back
whales on bent the fore spander
found it to be a sail not fit
for a ship, a main stay sail is
to be preferred as it takes less rigging
and is more easily managed
day ends with thick foggy weather
spoke the ship Frederick William
of Prussia bound to Valparaiso
saw Whales supposed to be sperm
but soon lost sight of them
No obs to be depended on

Friday
27th

112° out

begins with thick foggy weather
Wind at West
in company with ship Frederick William
of Prussia
Lat obs 44° 54' South

Saturday
28th

Right Whales

113° out

begins with foggy weather Wind from
WSW to WSW
steering by the North ward
at 6 A M saw several Right Whales
I had this night a very remarkable
dream concerning a future State
(so much so that I don't soon forget it)
day ends with thick foggy weather
Wind South
Lat obs 42° 48' South
Long by Lunar at 9 A M
64° 38' 00" West
by Chronometer at the same time
70° 20' West
