

Monday 9 th 185 ² out	1832 through the day fine winds from N E steering W by S Lat obs 15° 04' N Long obs 134° 28' W
Tuesday 10 th 186 ² out	through the day fine winds from N E steering W by S Lat obs 16° 04' N
Wednesday 11 th 188 ² out	through the day fine winds from N E to S E steering W by S Lat obs 17° 13' N
Thursday 12 th 188 ² out	through the day pleasant winds from N E to S E steering W by S employed in shifting some provisions out of the hold to the Rear 14 bbls Beef 8 of pork found one of the Rear barrels out having been stove in steering at home I believe Lat obs 18° 22' N
Friday 13 th 189 ² out	Begins with fine weather light from E S E steering W by S with hopes of getting 50 Barrels more of oil before making the Land but with small grounds for that hope to appearance Lat obs 19° 06' N
Sat 14 th Long obs 150 ² out at midnight	through the day fine weather at a great distance from N E to S steering W by S by Com pass No obs
Sunday 15 th 191 ² out	1832 Begins with fine weather Wind from E S E to S S E steering W by S by Com pass Long by D + X at midnight 152° 25' W Lat at same time 19° 14' N all hands has been scraping & whaling ship ready for paint Lat obs 19° 19' N
Monday 16 th 192 ² out	Begins with squally weather steering W by S at 2 P M Saw 500m Whales 4000 all the boats but could not get any Landward Boat fastened and the Iron dred at 9 P M lay by at 4 A M saw the East part of Oyster bearing W S W day ends with light breeze Lat obs 19° 04' N
Tuesday 17 th 193 ² out	Begins with light breeze from E S E S E steering W by S through the day pleasant winds and fine weather at 11 P M called the South Point of Oyster So End the day
Wednesday 18 th 194 ² out 244 bbls oil on Boards	Begins with pleasant weather Wind at West at 4 P M Came to anchor in 20 fathoms this night 2 green hawks swam to shore hoping to get from here to Waikiki and to pay their ship bill
