219^{out}
Begins with thick weather
approaching to fog Wind at South
Storing W by South by Compass
No Signs of Whales
and I fear we shall make about
Summers work of it
at 8 A M saw a School of
Sperm Whales Lored all the
Boats but could not get on
at 11 Returned on board
Lat obs 32° 50' N
Long by Chronometer at
4 P M 177° 14' W

Saturday
19th
220^{out}
45
Barels
at 1 P M Lored all the
Boats after the same Whales
and fasted & killed one
took him to the Ship at half past
3 P M begin to Cut at 6 Do
got all in but the head
Double Reeped and Lay by
the head
at 4 A M took in the head
and began to Boil
thick foggy weather Wind S by E
made Sail to the Eastward
Lat obs 33° 13'
Long at 3 P M 176° 12' W

Sunday
20th
221^{out}
1832
begins with fine weather Wind S by E
Storing to the S by E Saw Osprey
Employed Boiling out Boddy
at 10 A M finished Boiling
Turned up on deck 45 lbs
day Ends with fine breezes from
S by E Storing S W
Lat obs 33° 10' N
Long at 3 P M 177° 31' W

Monday
21st
222^{out}
Begins with fine weather Wind S by E
Storing S W Lat obs 32° 39' N
Long Lunar at 8 A M 178° W
Long by Chronometer 178° 21' W

Tuesday
22nd
223^{out}
begins with pleasant weather and
fine breezes from South
Storing W by W Latter part
thick weather No obs

Wednesday
23rd
224^{out}
Begins with thick rainy weather
Wind South Saw Jumboes
off I can get 50 barrels more this
month I shall be contented for
present but I fear we shall not
get any more
I wish my Enemy no worse than
to come after Whales and not find
them being masters of Ships
at 5 P M with pleasant breezes from
North Lat 32° 31' N
Long 178° 30' East
at 4 P M
