15th

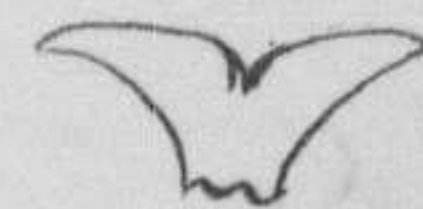
