Remarkable
Lat 38° 6' N. Long 128° 42' W

12th

Through the day fine weather
Wind S.E. Strong
Lat 38° 7' N. Long 127° 46' W

Sunday
13th

Through the day fine
weather and light Breeze
from South
Lat 38° 6' N. Long
124° 40' W

Monday
14th

January 1833

Begins with Pleasant
weather and variable Winds
from South to S.E.
Hearing to Eastward
No Whales

Tuesday
15th

Through the day Squally with
Rain and variable Winds
Saw two pairs of black fish
but no Whales is here
I am all most in Despair
of finding them
I think I should be
content to get 1 but
yet 300 barrels by April
I don't expect it
Lat 38° 30' N.

Wednesday
16th

Begins with Squally
Rainy weather Wind variable
I am trying to get to the South
out of the Rain but there
seems to be some fatality
about it
No Whales

Thursday
17th



150 lbs

Begins with Squally weather
Wind variable
at 4 A.M. Saw 1000 Whales
I fired all the Balls I had &
killed one fastened to 2 more
line parted & I ran from
him took the Whales to
Ship and cut her in
Lat 38° 5' N. Long 124° 15' W
