Thursday 21st	Wind ESE No Whales yet Employed Reparing Sails Lat 68 1/2 miles N
Friday 22nd	Begins with fine weather and strong breeze from ESE Employed Reparing Sails Here seems but small prospect to get 100 barrels more this season and all on board becomes more uneasy every day and I find it more difficult to govern them and my self God grant that I may do it with propriety and that my Owners may be satisfied with my conduct
Sat 23	through the day fine weather Wind ESE Saw Black fish Lat 68 1 01 Sea the
Sunday 24th	fine weather Wind East Saw Black fish & porpoises Lat 68 30 miles South Long Lunar 128-22 W

February 1833	
Monday 25th	Begins with fine weather and small prospect of getting Whales here Leave this ground this afternoon if no Whales is seen before then Hope to some & weather Often on this voyage but I know not what fruit it will bring forth There seems some appearance of early frost but I must make use of it and cannot remove it to some more propitious time Lat 10 miles South
Tuesday 26th	No thing to remark Lat 10 1/2 miles
Wednesday 27th	Nothing remarkable Spoke Ship Rosalie of Warren 26 mon 18 out At 1400 AB
Thursday 28th	Nothing remarkable but No Whales 1/2 miles South
Friday 1 March	March 1833 Thus I begin the month with no Whales and small prospect of any 3 1/2 miles South Lat
