Begins with fine weather
at 4 P.M. Van Whales
Loaded and struck 3
the four turned down proper
and lined the led
Lost all but one
took him to ship
cut him up

Begins with fine weather
Wind East
Employed Baillie
Lat 42° 23' N

Sat 23rd

through the day fine weather
Wind variable
Lat 42° 36' N

Sunday 24th

First and middle Part
Squally with Rain
Day by Moon the Night
at 6 A.M. made sail to the
South North West
Lat 42° 41' N
Long by Chronometer
139° 09' W

Monday 25th

Begins with Present weather
Wind ESE Strengthening to
North
Day ends with nothing but

Tuesday 26th

through the day fine weather
Except one or two light
showers of Rain
Lat 42° 41' N

Wednesday 27th

through the day Present
weather between showers of
Rain & men of duty sick
they are taken with Pain in
the Pit of the Stomach
are vomiting
