Wind at East
1534 lbs oil on board
Storing in by compass
Employed starting water
and getting up hooks
Scraping the mast &c
Lat 18° 18' North
Long Chronometer 146° 28' W

Sunday 7th Through the day fine weather
Wind East Storing water
Lat 18° 15' North
Long Chronometer 148° 51' W

Monday 8th Through the day fine weather
Wind East Storing water
Lat 19° 14' North
Long Chronometer 151° 15' West

Tuesday 9th Through the day fine weather
Wind East Storing water
Employed starting water in the
New Cask
Lat 19° 13' North
Long Chronometer 153° 29' W

Wednesday 10th Began with light breeze
from East Storing water
at 9 A.M. Sailed East
End of Oyster
Lat 19° 12' North Long 154° 19' at
8 A.M.

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Thursday 11th Began with fine weather
Wind S.W.
at 9 P.M. Passed the
Southern Point of Oyster
Day Ends with light
Breeze from S.W.
Saw a ship a stern of us

Friday 12th Began with fine weather
Wind S.W.
Employed in working up the
Ship towards Pokoa Bay
hook on board Debuty
Pilot to end the day

Sat 13th Through the day fine weather
at 8 A.M. Sailed to anchor in
Bay of Hwarakoa
Day Ends in fly in trade

Sat 20th at 1 A.M. took the anchor
and stood to sea for Morue
with 11 Barrels Potatoes and
25 lbs yams & goats
Banana and Plantains in abundance
Sleeping for a sleeping
Wind from the land

Sunday 21st Began with fine weather
Wind at North by East
at 6 P.M. Sailed towards
Oyster at 8 P.M. through the
Night at Day light
Saw in Land the Oyster
had let us to Land
