Monday through the day Implied in
working the ship to windward
without success

Tuesday 23rd at 4 A.M. kept off for
Wahoe finding it of no
use to try to get in to mouth
as the wind is at N.E.
and a strong current
setting out of the Passages

Wednesday at 6 P.M. came to anchor
at Waikou Bark in 10 fath
water Small Bower anchor
in order to take of water
at 4 A.M. took on shore a
Raft of 23 Casks at 12 noon
had them all filled
and sent the Day with
strong gails from N.E.

Thursday 24th at 5 A.M. took on shore
30 Casks at 11 P.M. got them
all off the ship safe
Discharged the Cook
John Anderson & shipped
another on and on Leman
and 2 natives
So ended the day

Friday 25th at 6 P.M. took the Inkote
with 2 Pleasant Breeze from
N.E. 4 men in well

Sun fine by Lat 33 30 04 S

Friday 3rd through the day Breeze
thick & cloudy with light
showers of Rain
Lat 33 30-55 North
