Sat 25 th	Begins with calm weather on 6 to reach at 2 P.M. Saw as sail to S.E. of us Steering to Westward Saw 2 or 3 of 8 find better through the Night Steered S.W. End with Pleasant weather Winds S.W. Lat obs 32-23 N Long by Lunar at 3 P.M. 177-48 West by Chronometer 178-46

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Sunday 26 th	Begins with fine weather Steering W by P Small Prospects of Eng Whales this month, and if fine I shall make but small work this Season however I believe all is fixed for the best, unalterable I intend to go down to 170° E if I see No Whales soon Lat obs 32-54 North
Monday 27 th	Winds to Southward Lat obs 32-24 N
Tuesday 28 th	Winds to Westward with fine weather 32-36 Lat
Wednesday 29 th Clear	Winds variable with good Whale weather but No Whales Lat obs 32-26 N Spoke Ship, Maria Terese of New Bedford had seen 12 Whales Long Chronometer 178-11 W
Thurs 30 th Clear	Through the day Nothing Remarkable Winds W.S.W. Lat obs 32-31 N
Friday 31 st	Through the day thick cloudy weather Winds W.S.W. Saw an English Ship Lat obs 32-40 N
Sat 1 st June	Through the day Cloudy Imp'd by Repairing Sails Lat obs 32-42 N
