Day ends with S. Males

sails
Lat 32° 8' S
Long Chronom 178° 51' W

4th

Winds NW strong, East
at 4 P.M. S. E. latter part
W. S. W.
Lat 32° 21' S

Wednesday
5th

Winds SW strong to the
Eastward latter part
W. S. W. Saw Squid
Lat 32° 05' S

Thursday
6th

Begins with pleasant breezes
from SW strong to W & W
Employed Repairing Sails
Lat 32° 44' North

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Friday 7th

Begins with foggy weather
Winds NW strong to W & W
Part fine with winds W & W
Saw great numbers of Clams
and a kind of P. denticulatus
Lat 32° 31' S
Long by Chronometer
178° 44' W

Saturday 8th

Begins with fine weather
and light airs from West
Strong to S & W
Sleek Core made there first
appearance this day
Lat 31° 56' North

Sunday 9th

Begins with fine weather
Winds West strong to S & W
Nothing to Ensign the prospect
no Males, Mate Sick
Second and third Do growling and
grumbling and growing more sick in
stomach, already to much so,
Poor Captain I pity you
you have but little to comfort
you but you wish to conduct
with propriety, tedious hours
days and months you have to
pass with labor comforts
less encouragement to come a
Whaling, Come if you are obliged
to come stay at home if you can
