Thursday
20th

Through the day fine weather
Wind S. & East one ship in
sight at 9 A.M. saw a large
School of Blackfish
boarded all the Boats to success
Lat 28° 42' North

Friday
21st

Through the day fine weather
No Whales Lat 28° 34'

Sat 22nd

Begins with fine weather
Wind E. & S. at 6 P.M. saw a large sperm
Whale and soon after 2 more
going South or S.E.
Lured all the Boats with out
success through the night
Lured to Southward in hopes of
finding big whails again or some
other small hope like sure
Lat 28° 43' N
Long 112° 09' East

Sunday
23rd

through the day fine weather
Wind East saw several
Schools of Blackfish & Porpoise
at 11 A.M. spoke ship
Pocahontas of Baltimore
Swift master 23 months out
got barrels oil
had seen Whales 2 or 3 days
and got 1 large one
Lat 29° 26' N

June 1833

Monday
24th

Begins with fine weather
and light breeze from East
at 9 P.M. took in
sail and hauled up by the wind
I pity him who needs it more
than my self, however there is one
Shure Remedy for the ills of life
one that we hope is far off
tho we know not how ney it may be
I mean Death, Dredful but Shure,
we Trust we shall see before
to gain what we know not that we
shall stay to use and cannot carry
with us thing of this world
at 9 A.M. saw a School of
Sperm Whales going South
Lured all the Boats in Company
with ship Pocahontas with out
Success So do

Tuesday
25th

Begins with fine weather Wind W.S.W.
at 2 P.M. saw Whales Breaching
Lured all the Boats and at 4 P.M.
started and killed one large one
took him to ship Harbor boat
Store badly 2 ships in sight
Lat 29° 33' N

Wednesday
26th

through the day strong breeze
from N.W. saw
Spoke ship Rebecca Lewis of
New Bedford 9 months out
with 600 lbs
Lat 29° 20' N
