from West
Lat obs 28° 30' N

Friday
28th

Nothing Remarkable
Lat obs 29° 15' N

Sat 29

Begins with Pleasant weather
Wind West
Saw Whales Landed all the
Boats and Mast Boat
Shuck and after
being fast on haul and
Whale on top of water all
the time hounded and
lost one line & 2 lines
Chased until light
but could not fasten.
at 8 A.M. saw a dead
Whale 4 miles to windward
Sent 3 Boats and took
him to ship 2 Ships in sight
Day ends cutting
Lat obs 28° 20' N

Sunday
30th

Begins with fine weather
almost calm
employed cutting at 3 P.M.
got all in but cable
2 Ships in sight
Lat obs 28° 30'

July 1833

Monday

Begins with fine weather
Wind East
at 4 P.M. spoke ships
Marine Colman 11 months
400 lbs. Fabella Tabaco
25 months 1400 lbs
Lat obs 28° 43' N

Tuesday
2nd

Begins with fine weather
Wind N.E. strong
by North
Employed storing down oil
in after hold
Lat obs 28° 44' N
Long Chronom 113 East

Wednesday
3rd

Through the day Nothing
Remarkable
Saw 2 Ships,
day ends storing down oil
Lat obs 29° 23' N

Thursday
4th

Begins with fine weather
Wind S.E. took to Southward
at 5 A.M. took to N. Eastward

Friday
5th

Nothing Remarkable
but no Whales
Lat obs 29° 44' N

Sat 6th

Through the day Storing down
oil &c &c
Lat obs 28° 36' N

Sunday
7th

Nothing Remarkable
Lat obs 28° 47' Long 112° 16' E
