

November 22 1833

Friday 22nd at 4 P.M. took the Anchor and made Sail to S.E. in hope of getting a hundred barrels of oil by midnight. I think there is small prospect of it but hope I may be disappointed. Lat 20° 36' N

Saturday 23rd through the day fine weather. Windy. East. Sail to S.E. Morning to S.E. and on Boiling. Lat 19° 41' N

Sunday 24th through the day fine weather. at 4 P.M. lost sight of Eyder. Lat 18° 26' North

Monday 25th Begins with Pleasant weather. Wind S.E. Steering by the S.E. Saw a small sperm whale. Laid with out success. Lat 16° 59' N

Tuesday 26th Begins with cloudy weather. Wind from East. at 6 P.M. spoke ship ahead of us. Light had about 1000 lbs. since leaving the Island. Lat 15° 18' N

Wednesday 27th Begins with Pleasant weather. Wind from N.E. to East. In forenoon setting up the fore Reefing. Lat 14° 20' N

Thursday 28th through the day strong breeze from S.E. Morning S.E. Lat 13° 14' N

Friday 29th through the day fine weather. but strong breeze from S.E. Lat 12° 58' N

Saturday 30th through the day strong trade winds. clear blue. Received 1000 lbs. Long by Chronometer at 3 P.M. 184° 40' W

Sunday 1st Dec 1833 } Nothing remarkable through the day but strong breeze from S.E. Lat 11° 06' N

Monday 2nd as day preceding. to it today. Lat 9° 53' N

Tuesday 3rd strong gale with some rain. Lat 8° 36' N Long Chronometer 182° 44' W
