air the wind East
I saw a Shale of Whales
Landed all the Boats
with out success
Lat 46 24 N

17th
Through the day fine weather
Wind from East
Employed Repairing the
main top sail
Lat 46 24 N

Wednesday
18th
Began with fine weather
Wind East
at 6 A M began
to take out oil to Cooper
in main hatch
Lat 46 24 N

Thursday
19th
Began with Pleasant weather
Wind at East
Employed Coopering
oil in main hatch
Lat 46 33 N

Friday
20th
Light Wind and pleasant
weather Employed Stowing
down oil and shapen out
Saw a Ship to the West
Lat 46 miles N

Dec 1833

Sat 21st Pleasant weather and light air
Employed Stowing oil in main
hold Lat 44 miles South

Sunday
22nd
A Baked Ship John Gayshaw
up in Port Road
with 600 bls oil
Lat 46 11 miles South
Long Chronometer 131° 24'

Monday
23rd
Began with fine weather
and Pleasant breeze from East
Storing to N N E
Oh, what shall we do
for Whales I want to get
away this time but
here I shall do but little
towards it all if for the
best now daught
Lat 47 miles North

Tuesday
24th
Through the day fine weather
Storing to North
Employed in Coopering oil
Lat 46 16 miles N

Wednesday
25th
Fine weather all hands
Employed in shapen out
and Coopering
Saw a Ship to the West
Lat 46 miles N
