Thursd 13	through the day Wind from Westward some squalls of Rain but mostly Pleasant Strong ESE by Compass Lat obs 7-12 South Long by Chronom 147-34
Fryd 14	fine wind from NNE Gentle ESE thick Cloudy weather No obs
Sat 15	Wind at N the thick weather some Rain Course ESE No obs
Sund 16	Wind N E Strong by the ESE Lat obs 8-14 South Long obs 147-34

February 1834

Monday 17 th	Pleasant weather Wind from NNE to East Lat obs 9-36 South
Tuesday 18 th	Pleasant weather Wind ESE at 2 P.M. San Caroline Islands bearing the keel of ship it hit at 6 P.M. halted by the ship as it is to late to land though I am in want of more the Island is very low and considerable wood on it there could be safe landing there is not much doubt a ship could be supplied Day Ends at Lat 10-39 S
Wednesday 19 th	through the day light air from the NNE to ESE Lat obs 10-42 South
Thursday 20 th	through the day light winds and variable NNE
Friday 21 st	through the day strong wind all hands employed taking the Digger Lat obs 11-06 South Long 148-44 W Chron
Sat 22	almost Calm Lat 13 04 S Long 148-39 W Chron
