15<sup>th</sup> Begins with fine weather  
Wind East Strong NW  
Land lying open to the west  
No signs of Whales  
Employed caulking Deck  
under the wind bar  
Day ends with no Whales and  
small prospect of any  
If we wish would do any good  
I should wish I had stayed  
on the line there I think I should  
get 100 or more Whales here  
I hardly think any  
What ever is it Right  
God who ruleth all  
Certainly will not  
have any thing being  
Lat 29-18 N

Sund  
16<sup>th</sup> Begins with fine weather  
Wind at S S E Strong to  
E S E, hope Bury the soul  
Lat 29-16 N  
Long by Chronom 173-48 E

Mon  
17<sup>th</sup> Begins with fine weather  
Wind S S E Strong to East  
Land & signs of Whales  
at 5 A M began and broke  
and some oil between decks  
found it to leak from  
also heeled the ship and  
scraped the bends and the bottom  
as far down as we could  
found it very foul with  
Clams and grass  
Lat 29-21 N

Tues  
18<sup>th</sup> Begins with fine weather  
Employed caulking etc  
Pretender decks at 6 P M  
taked ship to S W wind  
Lat 29-49 N  
Long Chronom 175-02  
No Whales yet
