trade winds at they blow
almost constantly from the
E. S. E. & N. E.
I have after thought
before this that I should
make a bad dead work
of it but there never was
more appearance of it than
at this time
A whale and its signs of
them have almost begun
to flag

Long 167-48 W

Tuesday
29th

Through the day almost calm
Lat 31-41 N

Wednesday
30th

at 2 P.M. Saw 3 large whales
going to Westward.

Thursday
31st

Loaded all the Boats and
started and killed one of them
took him to ship

at 4 A.M. began cutting
at midday get all in but
the whale had that up to Boat

Lat 31-43 N
This whale turned up a
Deck 108 bbls

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Friday
31st

fine with E. S. E. & S. E. wind
light from E. S. E.
Lat 32-12 N

Saturday
1st

August
Fine with wind E. S. E.
fine weather Boating but at 8-10

Sunday
2nd

fine Breeze from N. S. E. strong
to E. S. E. Lat 32-10 N

Monday
3rd

Strong gale from E. S. E.
with light showers of Rain
Lat 31-49 N
Long 167-48 W

Tuesday
4th

Strong gale from E. S. E. & East
I feel anxious to get 100 bbls
more before I get in port
but think there is small prospect
of it Lat 32-26 N

Wednesday
5th

fine with wind E. S. E.
Lat 32-03 N
Long 166-26 W

Thursday
6th

fine with wind E. S. E.
Employed stowing down all
between decks and Repairing
the Shore Boats
