



August 1834

Thurs 22<sup>d</sup>

Begins with fine mizzen  
from East blowing by the  
S & by S

 15 lbs

at 11 A M saw a school of  
Sp. m. Whales. One all  
the boats and struck &  
killed 2 & lost one  
to the other to ship.

 10 lbs

Lat 23-49 N  
Long Chron 157-24 West

Sat 24<sup>th</sup>

Begins with strong breeze  
and squally from East  
begin to cut at 4 P M  
at 7 P M get them all in  
and make sail to S & S  
Wind East latter part  
imply a B. Miller's wind  
blowing S & by S from East  
Lat obs 22-42 N  
Long Chron on 157-24 West

Sund 25<sup>th</sup>

At 4 P M saw the land  
Islands nearby to the  
day

Mon 26<sup>th</sup>

at 7 A M kept off the main  
finding I could not get in  
at anchor the wind blowing  
of the East by

August

Tues 26<sup>th</sup>

Strong breeze from East &  
at 6 P M came to anchor  
off Waikoo Peak to 14 fathoms  
Water inside border in rear

Wed 27<sup>th</sup>

Dock the anchor and made sail  
to the home keeping the  
100 lbs. out on the Passy -  
at 10 A M begin to collect  
some of the air Partum dots  
by Ende with strong gale and  
a bad sea Lat obs 20-06 N

September 1834

Thurs 1<sup>st</sup>

Short sailing sea and land wind  
imply a Cooper's air  
saw a cow bark had heaved  
half out to the end the day  
Lat obs 19-40 N

Fri 2<sup>nd</sup>

Strong breeze from East  
fine weather since Pleasant  
breeze from East &  
Lat obs 17-40 N

Sat 3<sup>rd</sup>

Came on by Preceding  
Lat obs 15-50 N
