Tues 10 Fine weather Wind S E
 we beat the 10 1/2 top sails and
 went to the Sea
 Re packing the main sail
 - Lat 18 27-18 N
 Long 100-10 W

Wed 11 Begins with pleasant weather
 Wind S E E gale S W by S
 Employed in stowing Potatoes
 - Lat 18 28-10 N
 Long 100-10 W

Thurs 12 Through the day Wind variable
 from S W to N W
 Saw a large flying boat
 - Lat 18 28-11 N
 Long 100-10 W

Fri 13 Begins with light baffling Winds
 from S W to N W
 Four of the crew of Duty Sick
 at 1 A M Spoke Schooner John
 Ferguson from Norfolk Bound to
 Annapolis Lat 18 28-10 N

Towards New Bedford

Sat 14 Begins with slightly weather
 Wind light and variable
 from S E to S W
 Departed Sail. In sight
 Day Ends with strong gale
 from S E
 - Lat 18 24-30 N
 Long 100-34 W

Sund 15 Begins with heavy gale from
 S E by S up under
 10 1/2 Reeled top sails and
 fore course
 day Ends more moderate
 Saw a large flying boat
 - Lat 18 31-40 N
 Long 100-34 W

Mon 16 Begins with Wind S E
 E gale S W by S
 Saw several flocks of vesp
 striking to S E
 day Ends with light air
 from S E
 - Lat 18 31-40 N
 Long 100-34 W

Tues 17 Begins with heavy sea from N E
 middle part calm
 later part fine breeze
 from S E
 - Lat 18 32-33 N
 Long 100-34 W
