This day commences squally with a heavy gale from the N.E. laying too under close reefed main topsail main spencer & foretopmast staysail saw one ship in the afternoon the wind hauled to the W. S.W. thus ends

Saturday March 11th

This day commences cloudy with fresh breeze from the N.W. at day light ~~main~~ made sail starting on the wing spoke the Barque Fenwick of N.L. Capt. Chester 400 bbls at 1 P.M. saw one right whale lowered & struck him & killed & brought him along side & let him lay all night took in sail

This day commences cloudy with fresh breezes from the N.W. at daylight called all hands & cut in the whale & started the tryworks & made sail steering on the wind saw several ships thus ends pleasant at night took in sail

This day commences squally with thick fog & fresh breezes from the N.E. laying too under close reefed main topsail & foresail & main spencers in the afternoon the wind hauled to the W. thus ends saw nothing

Wednesday March 15th

This day commences squally with fresh breezes from the N.W. laying too under close reefed main topsail foresail & main spencer broke out the fore hatch & slowed down the sail thus ends saw one ship
Lat 44 07 S Long 50 40 E

Thursday March 16th

This day commences pleasant with light breezes from the W.S.W. at daylight made sail steering on the wind at 7 P.M. saw one right whale lowered struck & killed him & brought him along side & let him in in the afternoon it came on to blow took in sail thus ends
