Saturday March 18th

This day commences pleasant with no wind laying too under close reefed main topsail & foresail & in the afternoon finished boiling spoke the Dove N.E. Capt Bealody 500 lbs at night came on fresh breezes from the N.E. thus ends Lat 44 22 S Long 50 38 E

Sunday March 19th

This day commences squally with fresh breezes from the N.E. & rain broke out the under fore hatch & stowed down the in the afternoon the wind hauled to the W saw two ships thus ends squally with fresh breezes Got no observation

Monday March 20th

This day commences squally with fresh breezes from the W laying too under close reefed main topsail & foresail & main spinnaker spoke the Dove thus ends squally Lat 43 15 S Long 51 03 E

Tuesday March 21st

This day commences squally with fresh breezes from the N.E. laying too under close reefed main topsail & foresail spoke the ship at 11:00 took in the foresail at night Got no observation

Wednesday March 22nd

This day commences cloudy with rain & fresh breezes at daylight steering on the wind at 12 saw one right whale lowered & struck him & brought it along side & cut it in in company with the ship & the Dove at night took in sail thus ends Lat 44 08 S Long 51 08 E

Thursday March 23rd

This day commences squally with fresh breezes from the N.E. laying too under close reefed main topsail & foresail & main spinnaker at daylight started the tryworks in company with the ship & Dove thus ends Got no observation

Friday March 24th

This day commences squally with fresh breezes from the N.E. laying too in the morning broke out and stowed down the fore hatch finish boiling in company with the Dove Lat 44 03 S Long 52 58 E
