Thursday May 4th

This day commenced pleasant in steady watch went ashore on liberty & the aboard watch painted the aboard side ~~came on board in the morning~~

Friday May 5th

This day commenced squally the seaboard watch came off & the other ~~watch~~ went ashore & the seaboard watch painted the other side

Saturday May 6th

This day commenced squally with fresh breeze from the S.E. struck let go the other anchor off aboard except the draft of & on main line

This day commenced pleasant with the wind S.E. steering S.W. with whole topails and main topgallant sail saw nothing
Lat 4, 20 S and Long 18, 20 W

Thursday August 11th

This day commenced pleasant with a light breeze from the S.E. steering S.W. by S through the day took two English frigates one of which was the Menheim of London lowered the boat and went on board of her saw nothing
Lat 0, 35 S and Long 19, 23 W

Friday August 12th

This day commenced with pleasant weather with the wind S.E. steering S.W. by S with all sail set in company with the Menheim at 2 P.M. went on board of her saw nothing
Lat 2, 50 S and Long 20, 16

Saturday August 13th

This day commenced with pleasant weather with the wind S.E. steering on the wind with all sail set saw nothing
Lat 4, 40 S and Long 21, 24 W

Sunday August 14th

This day commenced pleasant with a pleasant breeze from the S.E. steering on the wind with all sail set in the morning at night took in topgallant sail saw nothing
Lat 4, 40 S and Long 21, 24 W

Monday August 15th

This day commenced squally with fresh breeze from the S.E. steering S.W. with whole main topgallant and single reefed fore topgallant saw nothing
Lat 6 00 S and Long 22, 20 W
