Sunday August 28th

This day commences pleasant with the wind at steering before the wind in the direction those who were going but did not see them at 10 AM. We luffed our course with wind S.E. by E. saw several fin backs

Lat 31 11' and Long 27 25' W

Monday August 29th

This day commences pleasant with fresh breeze from the N. steering S.E. by E. with all sail set at night took in topgallants and double reefed the topsails saw several humpbacks and fin backs

Lat 31 W and Long 27 25' W

Tuesday August 30th

This day commences pleasant with fresh breeze from the N. steering on the wind with all sail set saw nothing

Lat 32 40' and Long 27 40' W

Wednesday August 31st

This day commences pleasant with fresh breeze from the N.E. steering S.E. with all sail set saw nothing

Lat 33 18' and Long 28 42' W

Thursday Sept 1st

This day commences squally with rain and fresh breeze from the N. steering S.E. by S. through the day under close reefed maintop and foresail at night luffed by one by all night wind hauled off got no observation

Friday August 2nd

This day commences squally with the wind at steering S.E. by S. under double reefed topsails foresail saw nothing at night took in sail

Lat 34 16' and Long 30 18' W

Wednesday Sept 14th

This day commences squally with the wind at steering on the wind to the N. in the afternoon saw one right whale toward the boats but could not get nigh it at night took in sail

Thursday Sept 15th

This day commences pleasant with light winds from the N.W. running for the Island of Nightingale spoke the Electra of N.H. Capt Ward 1400 hours also the Cadmus A.D. Smith

Friday Sept 16th

This day commences pleasant with N. running for the Island of Nightingale the order went in shore saw a large school of sperm whales from the ship but the boats was 15 miles from the ship the Electra boats got one whale

Saturday Sept 17th

This day commences cloudy with a strong breeze from the N.W. steering on the wind under double reefed topsails and courses saw one whale at night took in sail

Sunday Sept 18th

This day commences pleasant with the wind at steering for the Island of Nightingale saw one ship to the leeward and luffed too off shore and took in sail saw no whales

Monday Sept 19th

This day commences with thick fog and rain with the wind at laying too under close reefed maintop and foresail saw one right whale
