Friday Nov 4<sup>th</sup>

This day commences pleasant with light breezes from the S. and S. W. at daylight made sail steering on the wind in the morning saw a ship to the windward at 12 saw several whales sail down at 2 P.M. toward the boat and struck 2 of them and lost one and saved the other got him along side about sundown let him lay along side all night

Lat 35, 34 Long 10 20 W

Saturday Nov 5<sup>th</sup>

This day commences foggy with strong breezes from the S. at daylight commenced cutting the whale and got through at 7, it killed made no pull but lay too under close reefed maintop sail and foresail in the night cut in to blow harder took in the foresail

Lat 35, 36 Long 10 25 W

Sunday Nov 6<sup>th</sup>

This day commences squally with fresh breezes from the S. W. at daylight saw a ship to the leeward 4 miles off kept company with her all day at night bore down by her it proved to be the Hamilton S. W. Capt Ludlow no oil luffed too under her to

Lat 35, 41 Long 10 21 W

Monday Nov 7<sup>th</sup>

This day commences squally with fresh breezes from the S. W. at daylight set double reefed topsail steering on the wind to the S. in company with the Hamilton started the tag works in the afternoon Capt. Tate went on and bore lat 35, 02 S Long 9 59 W

# Barque Pembroke

Tuesday Nov 8<sup>th</sup>

This day commences pleasant with light breezes from the S. W. at daylight made sail steering on the wind to the S. W. the Hamilton to leeward in the afternoon stowed down the oil at 4 P.M. the wind was and splendid ship Bar Charles Phelps of N. York Capt. Hall no oil saw nothing

Lat 35, 30 Long 10 15 W

Wednesday Nov 9<sup>th</sup>

This day commences cloudy with light breezes from the S. at daylight made sail steering on the wind to the S. W. saw at 11 P.M. came on to rain and blow at 12 took in sail saw several ships to the windward

Thursday Nov 10<sup>th</sup>

This day commences cloudy with strong breezes from the S. W. at daylight made sail steering on the wind to the S. W. saw one right whale

Lat 36, 15 Long 9 45 W

Friday Nov 11<sup>th</sup>

This day commences pleasant with strong breezes from the S. W. at 8 A.M. set double reefed topsails and fore sail steering on the wind to the S. W. at 9 A.M. shook one reef out of the maintop sail at 12 struck 6 whales saw nothing

Lat 36, 00 Long 8, 30 W

Saturday Nov 12<sup>th</sup>

This day commences pleasant with fresh breezes from the S. W. at daylight made sail steering on the wind to the S. W. with light sail set saw nothing

Lat 36, 15 Long 5 130 W
