This day commences pleasant with fresh breezes from the N. steering N. by E. with all sail set at 3 P.M. saw several whales; lowered the boats but they proved to be humpbacks at 4 P.M. spoke the ship Electra. Capt Ward 14 00 10 months out sailed all night. Thus ends the 13th

Monday Nov 14th

This day commences squally with strong breezes from the N. at daylight took in sail and here too saw a ship so toward in the afternoon it came on to rain and snow harder at 10 P.M. took the maintop sail thus ends the 14th
Lat no observation

Tuesday Nov 15th

This day commences cloudy with strong breezes from the N. S. W. at daylight took in sail and reefed topsails steering N. by E. at 8 P.M. shook out one reef at 9 P.M. saw several humpbacks. Thus at night took sail thus ends the 15th
Lat 37, 32 S Long 3, 30 W

Wednesday Nov 16th

This day commences with cloudy weather fresh breezes from the N. S. W. at daylight made sail steering on the wind to the N. in the afternoon it cleared off pleasant with light winds saw several humpbacks sailed all night. Thus ends the 16th
Lat 36, 58 S Long 3, 57 W

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Thursday Nov 16th

This day commences cloudy with strong fresh breezes from the N. steering N. by E. with all sail set. At 10 P.M. saw the wind hauled at 11 P.M. saw a ship and stored on the wind took in the top sails at 4 P.M. double reefed the topsails thus ends the 16th
Lat no observation

Friday Nov 18th

This day commences pleasant with light breezes from the N. steering on the wind with all sail set in the afternoon the wind shifted to the S. E. steered N. by E. saw one sail to the windward.
Lat 38, 12 S Long 6, 31 W

Saturday Nov 19th

This day commences pleasant with light breezes from the N. steering N. by E. with all sail set. At night took in sail and stored N. by E.
Lat 36, 42 S Long 10, 17 W

Sund Sunday Nov 20th

This day commences pleasant with light breezes from the N. E. at daylight made sail steering N. by E. in the morning saw two right whales lowered the boats but could not strike them spoke the Com Perry A. L. Capt Kempstead 140 bbls the Jager A. L. Capt Ward 50 bbls and the Barbara A. L. Capt Rowe 200 bbls.
